Enrollment Report Footnotes

Program type (i.e., elementary, middle, high, etc.) reflects the most recent administrative assignment. In recent years enrollment counts are compiled on or about the first of October. An enrolled student is defined as a student who attends one or more schools or programs within the District. Regardless of the number of schools or programs attended, each student is counted only once; the counts are unduplicated. Schools and programs that are no longer in operation are designated as 'closed'. Footnotes:

(1) In the 2007-08 school year, Clarendon ES and Portsmouth MS merged to form a KG-8 school. Enrollment counts for years prior to 2007-08 for Clarendon consist of grades KG-5 only. Enrollment counts for Portsmouth prior to 2007-08 are contained in the MS section of this report. Similarly, Hollyrood ES and Fernwood MS merged to form a KG-8 school as did Rose City Park ES and Gregory Heights MS (renamed Roseway Heights).

(2) In 2007-08 school year, Kellogg MS was closed. Eighth grade students that would have been enrolled at Kellogg for the 2007-08 school year were enrolled at Franklin HS. Tubman MS was also closed and a new Young Women's Academy was opened on the Tubman campus as part of Jefferson High School.
