Federal Child Nutrition Programs: While school breakfasts and lunches are available to all students, some students are eligible for either free or reduced price meals based on family size and income information supplied voluntarily by parents. The federal government provides funds for student breakfasts through the School Breakfast Program and lunches through the National School Lunch Program. Percents are based on October enrollment. Student entitlement data is provided by the Nutrition Services Office.
