## Spill Response Program

## Purpose:

The purpose of this program is to respond to spills involving the variety of hazardous and non-hazardous chemicals which are handled by the District, meet regulatory requirements for timely response and reporting, and for disposing of spilled material in a responsible manner. Spill clean-up assistance, materials, and documentation services are available from the Health & Safety Department in Facilities and Asset Management at the Blanchard Education Service Center. Outlined in this program are provisions for spill reporting.

## Definitions:

In order to know if we have a spill, we have to look at the legal definitions. Two definitions exist for spills, these are: "Incidental Spills" and "Spills".

**Incidental spills** are incidents which may be normally encountered during routine operations. Incidental spills could be illustrated by accidentally over filling a secondary container or the drippings from a leaky valve. Incidental spills do not need to be reported. If incidental spills happen on a continual basis then an evaluation should be performed to see if there is an alternative available to correct the situation.

**Spills** are incidents defined as unexpected and not normally encountered in day to day operations. An example of a spill would be the dropping and splitting open of a 55 gallon drum. All spills are to be reported to.
